### **Namibia**

Some years ago the young southwest African country of Namibia decided to invite people to come and spend a few days or weeks in their country. Namibia, which is twice as big as Germany, was once a German colony. Many street signs and town names still tell us of those times. But that's not the whole story.

Tourists love the 900-mile-long coast of sandy beaches and dunes. But only a few of them would really want to go swimming there, because the cold Benguela Stream from the South Pole comes too close to the coast. So almost all tourists come for the animals, and no one leaves without seeing the Etosha National Park. This is a wildlife reserve with one of the widest varieties of animals in the world. It was founded in 1907 and is one of the oldest in the world.

'It's a fascinating place,' says John White, 17, from Springfield, Illinois, who was in Namibia with his parents in 2007. 'It was the most outstanding holiday we've ever had,' he adds.

Springfield Post asked the White family why they like Namibia so much. 'Well,' Wayne White says, 'we like the African landscape, its special atmosphere and its character. The National Park, for example, has over one hundred water holes. It's very exciting to watch wild animals in the dry season, from May to October, especially in the mornings.'

'And in the late afternoons,' their daughter Jane continues, 'we could always follow the animals in a covered vehicle, which we were not allowed to leave.' 'We could even go picture-hunting without a park ranger,' Wayne remarks and proudly shows some more photos.

'I was really impressed by herds of 20, 50, even 100 animals,' Jane White reports. 'Elephants stand next to giraffes, and zebras next to ostriches, sometimes lions and leopards chase away other animals. And what's more, there are birds everywhere. A ranger told us that there are about 350 species.' She doesn't forget to say that she wants to become a biologist one day.

'But sometimes it can also get rather dangerous there. They told us to watch out,' Rose White says. 'Some snakes are very poisonous. A hunter told us that three weeks before our stay a German tourist had been bitten by a viper. They didn't have the right medicine with them, so the young lady died soon after.'

Every year Namibia's landscape and animals attract tourists from all over the world. One tourist official in Windhuk put it like this: What else can you do with a country of sand, rocky plains, a flat desert and mountains?'

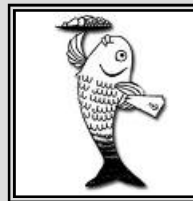
