The good life

On October 17, 1989, California had the second largest earthquake in the history of the United States. The centre of the earthquake was 75 miles south of San Francisco, near Santa Cruz. It lasted only fifteen seconds. But it was even felt in San Francisco. More than 60 people died, hundreds more were injured and lots of people lost their homes. The most horrible thing about the earthquake was that it came without any warning. And it came at five o'clock in the afternoon when many people were on their way home from work.

From northern California all the way to Mexico in the south, there is a long, deep line in the ground. This line is known as the San Andreas Fault. It is 600 miles long and ten miles deep. When rocks near this underground crack start to move, there can be an earthquake. The rocks move quite often. Somewhere along the San Andreas Fault there are at least two small earthquakes every week.

Many Californian towns are on or near the San Andreas Fault. The San Andreas Fault is not a big hole in the ground. You cannot look into it, but it is there under the ground in the countryside. Most Californians don't want to know about it. They don't think about it; they don't talk about it. For them it doesn't exist. They say that life in California is wonderful – even if the roof of your house might fall on your head one day.

At one place along the San Andreas Fault there is even a hotel where guests can swim in pools of naturally hot water which comes straight up through the Fault. Film stars from Hollywood come and stay here. Is anybody worried? Of course not. Most guests don't even know they are swimming in the middle of a future earthquake.

There is one place, however, which doesn't try to hide the fact that it is right on the San Andreas Fault. Parkfield is exactly halfway between Los Angeles and San Francisco. A sign says it is 'The Earthquake Capital of the World'. Parkfield has a long history of regular earthquakes with a big one every twenty years. Scientists believe a very big one could happen soon. In a town restaurant a sign says: Be here when it happens.
